The topic of the Meeting and Workshop will be: “The impact of intrinsic and extrinsic factors in site-specific lymphoproliferations”. The symposium will address genetic and microenvironmental factors of importance for oncogenesis and clinical behaviour of lymphoproliferations that present at specific locations, including immune-privileged and various extranodal sites. One part of the symposium will be dedicated to recent advances in lymphoma.
